Start planning your visit at GoMtCharleston.com to gather all of the important details you'll need for a great day in the snow!



Always check road conditions ahead of time for closures or chain requirements by calling 511 or visiting NVRoads.com and avoid driving in active storms, when there is low visibility and the roads will be snowy and icy!



Get here early! Roads and parking are usually full by 9 a.m. on weekends, holidays, and CCSD Winter Break. Cars may be stopped or turned around once the area is at capacity. Carpooling with friends is also helpful.



There are limited services, food, and restrooms available in the winter, so check out the options, maps, hours, fees, and more on GoMtCharleston.com and avoid trespassing on private property and closed areas.



Make sure your car is ready with supplies and a full gas tank for the trip, and don't rely on rideshare services or cell signal. Dress warmly and pack extra clothes, blankets, water, snacks, shovel, and bag of sand/kitty litter for traction in the trunk.



Do not sled in areas with less than 12 inches of snow and avoid traffic and dangerous objects like trees and rocks. Use sturdy sleds for snow play, not makeshift items like cardboard boxes.



Keep all pets on a leash and pick up your trash, pet waste, and broken sled pieces to keep the Spring Mountains beautiful for everyone to enjoy!
